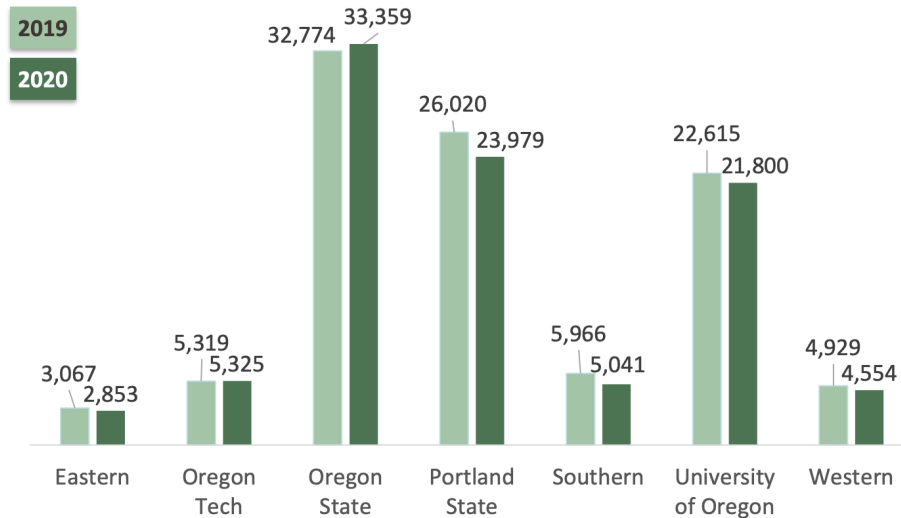


Provost Winningham's Faculty Senate Report November 24, 2020

1. Statewide Public Higher Ed Enrollment

Statewide community college enrollment headcount declined 23% from Fall 2019 to Fall 2020. Public university headcount declined 3.8% and FTE is down 3.9%. For the first time since at least 2011 community colleges headcount was below university headcount, with all Oregon community colleges experiencing a decline.
