
Greetings

2020 Grant proposal activity: a year in review

The start of a new academic year creates an opportunity to look forward and to look back. In 2020, the Sponsored Projects Office helped submit 55 proposals by 41 different faculty and staff members, totaling just under \$20 million. As of this writing, 29 of those proposal have been funded, bringing \$12,785,316 in grants and contracts. That's a 54.5% success rate for proposals, and brings in a revenue of \$757,401 of indirect dollars that



the university can use to support the finance and administration operations of sponsored projects.

Some highlights of successful FY 2020 grant applications, including projects in CLAS, CoE, WOU Foundation, Student Affairs, and in a TRI Center:

- Mathematics Assistant Professor <u>Dr. Leanne Merrill</u> received a <u>Dolciani Mathematics Enrichment</u> <u>Grant</u> from the Mathematical Association of America. Her project "Polk County Math Circle" was awarded \$5,000 for a unique partnership with local schools in which WOU students facilitate advanced math enrichment tutoring.
- <u>Darryl Thomas</u>, Professor of Dance, was awarded \$9,964 from <u>Oregon Sea Grant's Program</u>

 <u>Development</u> grant program. The project combines Dance with Computer Coding to interpret the effects of ocean acidification. The project is a multi-departmental collaboration between Computer Science, Biology, and Dance, with <u>Camila Gabaldon</u>, <u>Breeann Flesch</u>, and <u>Karen Haberman</u>.
- <u>Dr. Denise Thew-Hacket</u> received not just one, but two grants from the <u>US Department of</u> <u>Education Office of Special Education and Rehabilitative Services</u>. Both grants are for \$1,000,000 each, and 80% of the funds goes directly to students. The five-year projects increase participation in long-term training for students in the Rehabilitation and Mental Health Counseling program.
- <u>Dr. Megan Patton-Lopez</u> in the Division of Health and Exercise Sciences in the WOU College of Education received a grant for \$52,396 from the <u>Oregon Health Authority</u>. The project is a unique partnership with <u>Polk County Public Health</u> and the funds will train students as contact tracers.
- Director of Smith Fine Arts, <u>Lisa Schachter</u> in the WOU Foundation, received \$9,000 from the <u>Oregon Community Foundation's Oregon Arts and Recovery Program</u>. The funds will help sustain the Smith Fine Arts which experienced lost revenue due to COVID.
- Colin Haines, Director of the Veteran Resource Center, secured a grant from the Oregon Department of Veterans' Affairs. The grant is for \$76,226 and will help WOU promote services to Veterans. Under Colin's leadership, WOU was formally recognized as a Veteran Friendly Campus.
- Robyn Lopez-Melton from the Center for Early Learning and Youth Development in The
 Research Institute. was awarded a contract for \$770,844 from the Oregon Department of
 Education Early Learning Division to develop emergency standards for child care providers in
 response to COVID.

Special thanks to <u>Darryl Thomas</u>, Professor of Dance who submitted <u>five</u> grant applications during FY 2020, four of which were funded, the most by any faculty member.

FY 2021 is already off to a great start. By October 2019, the Sponsored Projects Office had helped submit \$1.1 million in proposals. By October 2020, that figure is nearly \$4 million. So, as you can see, some exciting news to think about as we move into the new academic year.
